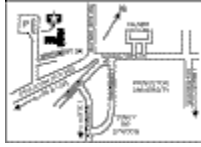

Directions:

The Suzanne Patterson Center is behind Borough Hall / Police Station in Princeton, NJ, where Route 206 (Bayard Ln./Stockton St.) meets Route 27 (Nassau Street).



Enter from Rt. 206 on the South side of Princeton via Monument Drive, parking available. The dance is located just behind (north of) Princeton Borough Hall. (See [map](#).)

From the south (Rte 206 northbound from Trenton): Enter from the south on USRoute 206 (Stockton Street), just before the traffic light at the junction of 206 and Nassau St. (NJ Route 27). Look for a tiny sign 'Suzanne Patterson Center' and a 'Police' sign on the left.

From the north (Rte 206 southbound): At the three-way intersection between Nassau St. and Rte. 206 north and south, NOTE: Monument Drive is blocked off. Therefore, proceed through the light at Nassau and 206 by making a right turn onto 206 South; soon you will see the Borough Hall driveway on your right (I think it's the first right turn you can take). Drive to the far end to the parkinglot. Additional parking in the Trinity lot (free after 6 p.m. and Sundays), on Mercer St., if needed.
